It drives almost all surveys conducted by the Census Bureau and impacts most all information reported on your community by the Federal government: from poverty to educational attainment, and from employment to business dynamics. The Census Can't Count Without Your Help

Without accurate corporate boundaries, the Census Bureau can't figure out who to count in the city, and who is out. Without accurate road networks, they don't know where to group a new housing unit. Your municipality knows best where the lines fall, when something new has been added, and when things have been removed or relocated. The Census Bureau's Geographic Support System, or GSS, allows local governments to update geographic information on a regular basis so that the Bureau will always be doing its work with the most current information for your community.
