**Note on Boxes with C's:** A "C" in a box on this table indicates an agency recycled the designated item by utilizing the Jefferson City (JC) or St. Louis (StL) recycling contracts. Materials collected via the JC contract include Mixed Office Paper and Commingled Materials (Cardboard, Aluminum, Plastic, and Steel (tin) Cans). A box that has a number over a "C" indicates the agency reported material that was recycled statewide, but not reported in the JC or StL contract figures. For example, conservation reported 6,100 pounds of commingled recycled and Conservation offices in JC utilized the JC Recycling Services contract to recycle commingled material.

**Note on "Totals by Material":** This column includes collection totals as reported by the recycling contractor for the following materials: Cardboard, Commingled, Electronic Scrap, Mixed Paper, Plastic, and Rubber Tires. Figures reported by the contractor do not appear in the table on this page; however, these figures are reflected in the "Totals by Material" column. Contractor figures are summarized in a table on page 3 of Appendix A. Agencies that utilized a recycling contract, but do not appear in this table include: Environmental Improvement Energy Resources Authority, Lottery, Tax Commission, MOSERS, Governor's Office, Attorney General, Auditor, and Senate. Amounts of materials recycled by these agencies are included in the "Totals by Material" column. (see explanation under "contractual reporting" in Appendix A, 3).

## Note on Total Printer Cartridges:

3,280 printer cartridges were recycled by employees using a statewide service for this item and are included in the TOTALS amount shown in this table. Note on Agency-Specific Printer Cartridges: Figures appearing for individual agencies may not be an accurate reflection of the number of printer cartridges recycled. In some buildings agencies utilize a centralized recycling drop-off for cartridges and it is not feasible to separate agency data once recycled.

## Contract Reporting

Total pounds recycled by agencies utilizing the Jefferson City, St. Louis, Kansas City, onsite document destruction, electronic scrap, and tire contracts are provided in the table below. These figures are reported as cumulative totals. Due to contract reporting, data is reported by building and it is not feasible to separate data by agency where there are multiple agencies in the same building.

All numbers in the table below are reflected in the "Totals by Material" column in the table on the previous page.

When adding figures in each row the following needs to be considered. Carpet contractors reported agency purchases of \$125,102. Construction Materials contractors reported purchases of \$368,541. Office Supplies contractors reported purchases of \$428,664. MVE provided procurement figures for Cardboard Boxes (\$119,746); Janitorial Supplies-plastic bags (\$469,265); Metal Products (\$226,001); Park & Playground Supplies-Recycled plastic picnic tables and benches (\$43,628); and Remanufactured Furniture & Recycled Fabric (\$375,770). *When adding the figures in each row-these amounts need to be included in the sum.*

**In FY19**, 61 percent of agency paper purchases included recycled content. The state of Missouri spent \$23,310 on recycled “Fine Paper Products” in FY19 for approximately 898 cases of recycled paper. A majority of this paper is printer/copier paper made with 30% post-consumer recycled paper. Purchasing this type of recycled paper compared to purchasing the same amount of virgin paper translates into the following estimated benefits:

-  27.5 fewer tons of wood used – 165 fewer trees
-  13,000 less gallons of water
-  71,000 fewer pounds of CO2 equivalent – 6.5 fewer cars on the road each year
-  600 less pounds of solid waste – 136 Americans generating no waste for one day
-  6 million fewer BTUs
