## Fiscal Year 2024 appropriations include funds for the following items:

- \$7,085,588 for food purchase contract funding.
- \$5,904,547 and 102 staff for Employee Support Services.
- \$5,106,596 for county jail reimbursements.
- \$3,328,638 for medical services.
- \$2,000,000 for vehicle fleet expansion.
- \$1,553,967 and 16 staff for the Western Missouri Training Academy.
- \$610,957 for substance use and recovery contract funding.
- \$518,221 Volkswagen Settlement Trust Fund for vehicle purchases.
- \$500,000 for an offender coding education program.
- \$406,942 and seven staff for the prison nursery program at Women's Eastern Reception, Diagnostic and Correctional Center.
- \$400,000 for a virtual job interviewing program.
- \$275,358 and six staff for reimbursable contract monitoring.
- \$150,000 for an offender bachelor's degree program.
- \$122,220 for probation officer safety equipment and training in support of the arrest team program.

## Vetoes in HB 9 include:

- (\$3,000,000) for a crime victim notification system.
- (\$550,000) for a digital therapeutics treatment program.
- (\$500,000) for a medication-assisted treatment program.

## Fiscal Year 2024 appropriations include reductions from the Fiscal Year 2023 core appropriation levels for the following items:

- (\$51,047,938) core reduction for one-time expenditures, including (\$1,200,219) general revenue, including:
  - o (\$49,500,000) Budget Stabilization Fund for the Hootselle lawsuit settlement.
  - (\$495,438) for the prison nursery program startup costs, including (\$247,719) general revenue.
  - (\$400,000) for moving operations from Western Missouri Correctional Center back to Crossroads Correctional Center.
  - o (\$300,000) for the virtual job interviewing project.
  - (\$250,000) for conversion of the Western Missouri Correctional Center into a training facility.
  - (\$100,000) Correctional Substance Abuse Earnings Fund authority.
  - (\$2,500) for equipment costs associated with the new Operational Excellence Coordinator position.
- (\$82,650) other funds and (281) staff core reduction from the Fiscal Year 2023 appropriation level, including:
  - (\$42,500) Inmate Canteen Fund and (1) staff at the Transition Center of Kansas City.
  - (\$40,150) Crime Victim Compensation Fund and (1) staff for a fund swap.
  - o (238) staff resulting from contracting of food services.
  - o (41) staff resulting from contract expansion for substance use services.
