2. CORE DESCRIPTION

The Missouri Office of Prosecution Services exists as an autonomous entity within the Attorney General's Office to assist prosecuting attorneys throughout the state in their efforts against criminal activity. The Office of Prosecution Services has developed and provides basic prosecutors' manuals and educational materials for prosecutors; coordinates the development, installation, support and maintenance of an automated case management and criminal history reporting system for prosecutors; prepares, disseminates and supplements indexes to and digests of statutes and appellate court decisions; trains prosecuting attorneys and circuit attorney and support staff on a statewide basis; provides legal research and trial assistance to prosecutors; provides forms and other common and appropriate documents employed in the administration of criminal justice; administers a witness protection program for potential witnesses and their immediate families in criminal proceedings or pending investigations; serves as a liaison for prosecutors with governmental agencies, associations, commissions, committees, task forces and allied professionals

Section 56.700 provides that funds shall be appropriated for prosecuting attorneys' offices within counties with DMH facilities to employ personnel to assist in carrying out the duties relating to DMH facilities. DMH agrees to this transfer. MOPS is best situated to coordinate communication with the prosecuting attorneys' and circuit attorney's offices.

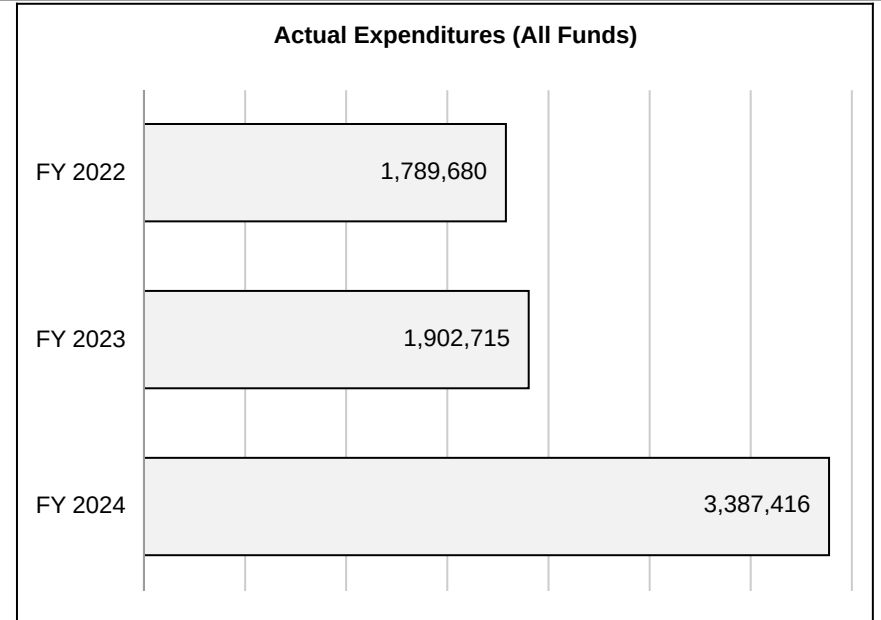

Assumptions: (1) Since only two counties (St. Louis and Jackson) and the circuit attorney have conviction review units, MOPS is responsible for actual innocence claims from the other 112 counties; (2) looking at what other states' statewide units have, and using Jackson County in particular, we need two experienced attorneys with backgrounds in prosecution and defense and an experienced investigator. Salaries of maximum of \$95,000 each for the attorneys and \$ 60,000 for the investigator. These salaries based on the current market in order to hire the required experience/qualifications for the public sector (a slight increase from the fiscal note on the TAFP bill).

The two resource prosecutors authorized in GR funding provide training and assistance to prosecutors and the circuit attorney in the areas of sexual assault, child abuse and neglect, financial and sexual exploitation of senior adults, and crimes involving other special victims. Over the past few years travel and other expenses have increased, partly due to increased requests for training and other assistance and partly due to increased costs in general in travel while there has not been an increase in E&E to cover those increasing costs. We need the increase in travel E&E to be able to meet the current and increasing demand for assistance by prosecutors and the circuit attorney.

The Office of Prosecution Services receives funds for the Statewide Victim Advocate Coordinator to coordinate the program and manage the grant and a VOCA Fiscal Officer to oversee the financial and statistical data for the program. In addition, prosecutors, and their staff receive training and coordination and are provided a resource to enhance any existing prosecutor based advocacy programs.

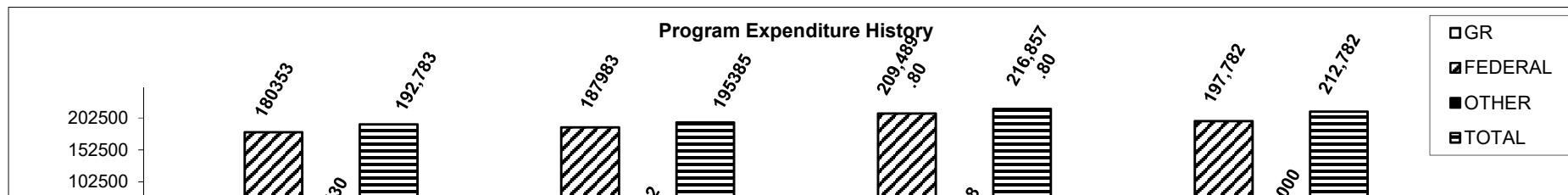

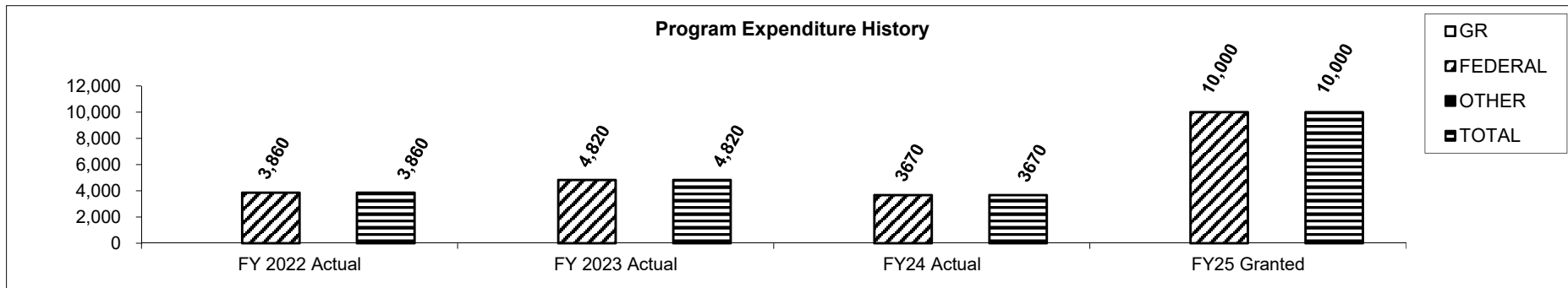
