The rule is being proposed primarily because of statutory and Executive Order requirements for preferences on purchases from Minority/Women Business Enterprises (MWBEs), Service Disabled Veteran Enterprises (SDVEs) and blind and sheltered workshops. The proposed rule applies equally regardless of the size of the bidder, and the agency has taken care to ensure that the procedures for applying the preferences are clearly stated in the proposed rule.
